2. Late bids will not be considered. Bids must be received in sealed envelopes (one to an envelope) with bid number and opening date & time written on the outside of the envelope.
3. Unit prices will be guaranteed correctly by the bidder.
4. Firm prices will be F.O.B. destination.
5. Purchases by Major County, Oklahoma are not subject to state or federal taxes.
6. This bid is submitted as a legal offer and any bid when accepted by the county constitutes a firm contract.
7. Oklahoma laws require each bidder submitting a bid to a county for goods or services to furnish a notarized sworn statement of non-collusion. A form is supplied below.
8. Bids will be firm until **November 22nd, 2022**
9. Other terms and conditions can be added at the discretion of county officers.

The Contractor shall furnish proof that all claims and obligations incurred by him in connection with performance of said work have been fully paid and settled; said information shall be in the form of an affidavit before payment of the Final Estimate to Contractor. All bids and/or proposals must comply with the following provisions:

**(C)** Equal Employment Opportunity. **(E)** Contract Work Hours and Safety Standards Act (40 U.S.C. 3701-3708). Where applicable, all contracts awarded by the non-Federal entity in excess of \$100,000 that involve the employment of mechanics or laborers must include a provision for compliance with 40 U.S.C. 3702 and 3704, as supplemented by Department of Labor regulations (29 CFR Part 5). The requirements of 40 U.S.C. 3704 are applicable to construction work and provide that no laborer or mechanic must be required to work in surroundings or under working conditions which are unsanitary, hazardous or dangerous. These requirements do not

apply to the purchases of supplies or materials or articles ordinarily available on the open market, or contracts for transportation or transmission of intelligence.

**(F) Rights to Inventions Made Under a Contract or Agreement.** If the Federal award meets the definition of "funding agreement" under 37 CFR §401.2 (a) and the recipient or subrecipient wishes to enter into a contract with a small business firm or nonprofit organization regarding the substitution of parties, assignment or performance of experimental, developmental, or research work under that "funding agreement," the recipient or subrecipient must comply with the requirements of 37 CFR Part 401, "Rights to Inventions Made by Nonprofit Organizations and Small Business Firms Under Government Grants, Contracts and Cooperative Agreements," and any implementing regulations issued by the awarding agency.

SAM Exclusions contains the names of parties debarred, suspended, or otherwise excluded by agencies, as well as parties declared ineligible under statutory or regulatory authority other than Executive Order 12549.

**(I) Byrd Anti-Lobbying Amendment (31 U.S.C. 1352)—**Contractors that apply or bid for an award exceeding \$100,000 must file the required certification. The Major County Sheriff's Office is currently accepting solicitations for sealed bids. Project details are below. Measurements are included in specification sheets provided to bidder; project is turnkey ready from start to finish in 90 days.

#### **Scope of project:**

**Kitchen:** Remove sink, counter, cabinets, and countertops. Furnish and install stainless steel double door refrigerator, upright freezer, ice machine, double sink with garbage disposal, stainless steel counter with drawers, stainless steel 2 door cabinet, and stainless-steel worktable and range. Furnish and install stainless steel backsplash to sink area, range, and worktable area. Lay ceramic tile, add drop in ceiling tiles and install 2 2x4 light fixtures. Rewire existing electrical system and install panel box with hookup from basement. Add 2 new drains, plumb sink, install commercial style pull down commercial kitchen faucet, add plumbing to ice machine. Paint all walls.

**Pantry:** Remove cabinets, furnish, and install stainless steel shelving unit. Lay ceramic tile flooring from pantry area through booking area to lobby, add drop in ceiling tiles, install 2 2x4 light fixtures. Paint pantry area walls.

**Bathroom:** Remove vanity, toilet, cabinets, and hot water heater. Furnish and install vanity, toilet, stainless steel shelving. Lay ceramic tile flooring throughout. Rewire existing electrical system to kitchen panel. Install 2 1x4 light fixtures. Paint all walls.
